# 1. Introduction

Langley Park Learning Trust (LPLT) ran a public consultation from 11<sup>th</sup> December 2020 to 31<sup>st</sup> January 2021 regarding reciprocal sibling priority for admissions to its secondary schools, and the reduction of the Year 12 Published Admission Number (PAN) at Langley Park School for Girls (LPGS). Notification of the consultation was sent to all centres on Bromley Council's Directory of Schools and Colleges (2020). Parents were also notified through letters home, and a notice was posted in the local News Shopper. The admission arrangements are to be finalised and formally determined by 28<sup>th</sup> February 2021, to take effect for the 2022 intake of pupils.


The three proposals covered by the consultation are summarised below:

1. Awarding priority admission to a secondary school for siblings of an opposite sex pupil already attending the other LPLT secondary school.
2. In relation to the first proposal, discounting this rule where the elder sibling is in 6<sup>th</sup> Form and joined Year 12 from a non-LPLT secondary school.
3. Reducing the PAN for external candidates only to Year 12 at LPSG from 100 to 60.

## 2. Awarding priority admission to a secondary school for siblings of an opposite sex pupil already attending the other LPLT secondary school


Question: Both schools already give priority to children with an elder sibling at that school. Do you agree with the proposal to also give priority to children with a sibling at the other secondary school (but not the primary schools)?

### 3. Discounting sibling priority where the elder sibling is in 6<sup>th</sup> Form and joined Year 12 from a non-LPLT secondary school


Question: Both schools currently give priority to children with siblings who were external admissions to Year 12. Do you agree with the proposal to discount siblings who joined Year 12 from a non-LPLT secondary school?

## 4. Reduction of LPGS Year 12 PAN

Question: LPSG proposes to reduce its Year 12 PAN for external candidates from 100 to 60. It will still be possible to admit additional external candidates if internal admissions are lower than expected. Do you agree with this proposal?

## 5. Cohort analysis

Respondents were asked to indicate their 'status' by selecting from a number of options (e.g. 'Parent of a child at one of the Trust's primary schools'). The table below shows who responded and, for the four largest cohorts, how they responded to the question regarding sibling priority across the two secondary schools.
